Know More About the National Games for Persons with Disabilities and the National Special Olympic Games

Q1: What are the National Games for Persons with Disabilities and the National Special Olympic Games?

The National Games for Persons with Disabilities and the National Special Olympic Games (NGDSO) of the People's Republic of China, or in short the National Games for Persons with Disabilities (NGD) and the National Special Olympic Games (NSOG), are co-organised by the China Disabled Persons' Federation and the General Administration of Sport of China.

The NGD, featuring Paralympic sports, is the nation's highest level multi-sports event for persons with disabilities. The first NGD was held in Anhui in 1984 and 11 editions have been held so far. As regards the NSOG, which encourages persons with intellectual disability to participate in sports competitions, eight editions have been held since its inauguration in Guangdong in 1987. The two Games have been held as a joint event from 2015 onwards around once every four years for athletes with physical, visual, hearing or intellectual disability.

The 12th NGD and 9th NSOG will be held in Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao in 2025. It will be the first time for the Games to be co-hosted by the three places.

Q2: Where have the NGD and NSOG been held over the years?

The NGD and NSOG have been held as a joint event since 2015. The hosts, years and dates of the NGD and NSOG over the years are as follows -

Q3: How many editions of the NGD and NSOG did Hong Kong participate in? What were the results?

Since the establishment of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in July 1997, Hong Kong has participated in a total of seven NGD and five NSOG. The results in the past editions are as follows -

Q4: When will the 12th NGD and 9th NSOG be held?

The 12th NGD and 9th NSOG will be held in Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao for eight days from 8 to 15 December 2025. The opening ceremony and closing ceremony will take place in Guangzhou and Shenzhen respectively.

Q5: What events will be held at the 12th NGD and 9th NSOG?

The coming NGD and NSOG will cover a total of 46 sports. The NGD will feature 37 sports, including the Summer Paralympics and Deaflympics events, the Winter Paralympics and Deaflympics events and the mass participation events while the NSOG will feature 9 sports.

The 12th NGD will consist of three categories of events, namely Summer Paralympics and Deaflympics events, Winter Paralympics and Deaflympics events, and mass participation events. The Summer Paralympics and Deaflympics events will cover 20 sports: archery, athletics, badminton, basketball (wheelchair and deaf), boccia, cycling, canoeing, football (blind and deaf), goalball, para judo, weightlifting, rowing, shooting, swimming, sitting volleyball, table tennis, taekwondo, tennis, wheelchair fencing and triathlon. The Winter Paralympics and Deaflympics events will cover 6 sports: cross-country skiing, biathlon, alpine skiing, snowboard, curling and ice hockey. The mass participation events will cover 11 sports: table tennis, badminton, darts, Chinese chess, go, para dance sport, rope skipping, deaf basketball (3-on-3), deaf futsal, floor curling and roller skiing.

Competition events at the 9th NSOG will cover 9 sports, namely athletics, badminton, basketball, bocce, football, weightlifting, roller sports, swimming and table tennis.

Q6: Which events of the 12th NGD and 9th NSOG will be held in Hong Kong?

Hong Kong will stage four competition events: boccia, wheelchair fencing and table tennis (TT11) for the NGD, and table tennis for the NSOG. In addition, Hong Kong will organise one mass participation event of para dance sport.

Q7: Where will the 12th NGD and 9th NSOG events to be staged in Hong Kong be conducted?

It is planning to hold the events at the following venues –
